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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Purpose

The Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) serves as evidence of Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center's commitment to improve and support the health needs of Dubois, Martin, Pike, and Spencer County residents. The assessment, along with the implementation strategy, was initiated to identify the community's most important health issues in order to develop an effective implementation strategy to address such needs. This will in turn lead to a plan to improve the health and quality of care available to the area residents.

Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center (MHHCC) also assessed community health needs to respond to the regulatory requirements of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2012 (PPACA) and IRS Notice 2011-52 as it pertains to section 501(r)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which requires that each tax- exempt hospital facility conduct an independent CHNA.

1.2 Objectives

The 2020 Community Health Care Needs Assessment has four main objectives:

- 1. Develop a comprehensive profile of the demographics, health status, and environmental standing of Dubois, Martin, Pike, and Spencer County residents.
- Identify the health needs as well as evaluate accessibility and quality of personal and population-based health services.
- Discuss and strategize a plan of action for health care organizations, providers, and community leaders to prioritize and address issues that will improve the health and quality of life of residents.

4. Implement changes and/or programs to help support the health care needs, as well as make continuous improvements to lead the communities to better health. Analyze and prioritize health needs on a local level. Encourage local resources to work together to assure the future of health care.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2.1 Overall Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center Community

- Primary Service Area Counties: Dubois, Martin, Pike, and Spencer
- Approximate service area population in 2019: 85,424 (-0.4% change from 2016)
- 75% of inpatients at MHHCC reside in the primary service area

Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center gathered community input and data from collecting data during quarterly advisory meetings, and by completing a SWOT analysis with fourteen focus groups, to complete this assessment. From the assessment, priorities have been outlined and an implementation plan will be shared internally, with other health care organizations, and with advisory councils. The continuity of communication with advisory councils will continue to address local health care needs specific to each county.

2.2 The Process

- 1. Collect relevant demographics, statistics, and health data.
- 2. Conduct quarterly advisory meetings and fourteen focus groups.
- 3. Organize feedback.
- 4. Develop and implement a plan of action to address health care needs.
- 5. Share the Community Health Care Needs Assessment with county officials, area health care providers, community-based organizations, and the public via the Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center website.

3. COMMUNITY

3.1 Demographics

The areas of focus for this assessment's purpose – to provide the health care needs for the surrounding areas- are Dubois, Martin, Pike, and Spencer counties. Diagrams outlining the specific factors of each county are shown below.

Given Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center is located at the heart of Dubois County, the assessment has a larger amount of data regarding Dubois County. Dubois County represents 25.5% of the total population served by MHHCC.



The demographics of each county in the PSA are broken down into population, population change, births and deaths, population estimates by age, and population estimates by race.

The following data is a side-by-side comparison of demographic profiles of each county. This comparison displays an overview of the surrounding counties. From a population standpoint,

Dubois County has the most residents of the comparing counties and has had positive population growth since 2010. The highlighted figures in red note the lowest figures, while the blue highlighted figures note the highest figures. "The American Community Survey (ACS) helps local officials, community leaders, and businesses understand the changes taking place in their communities. It is the premier source for detailed population and housing information about our nation" (American Community Survey, 2020). The category "Reporting One Race Only means that those surveyed felt they were accurately classified by one race alone. Of those percentages, the following two categories, Only African American and Hispanic are part of the "Reporting One Race Only category (i.e. in Dubois County 98.7% of the population surveyed felt they classified themselves as one race). Of that 98.7%, there were 0.4% that felt their one race was African American, and of that same 98.7%, another 7.3% felt they were most closely identified as Hispanic race (American Community Survey, 2018).

The top industry is furniture manufacturing, but other thriving businesses include healthcare, engines & transmissions, electronics and logistics.

3.2 Trends in Community Health

Health is a priority in the state of Indiana because of the importance of keeping residents safe and well. With constant change evolving in the daily lives of all, trends with infections, flu, and diseases can affect the overall health of mass communities.

As MHHCC has navigated the COVID-19 pandemic, a need was identified to provide tests for patients within the communities served. MHHCC immediately "stood up" a clinic for testing symptomatic patients, as well as a drive thru testing site. Since March 2020, this initiative has transitioned to the local health department offering testing along with MHHCC continuing to test symptomatic patients by offering testing in the ED, Urgent Care, and the Memorial COVID-19 Drive Thru. In addition, MHHCC worked to fulfill a community need for additional testing sites by adding testing sites at nine additional primary care locations including:

4.2 Advisory Councils

Advisory Councils were developed and implemented in 2014 as a way for MHHCC to stay connected with each county outside of Dubois County. It was identified there were several needs that were specific for each county. Members of the MHHCC management team are assigned to a county to continue the collaboration and to receive ongoing feedback on needs and where MHHCC is able to provide assistance. Participating in these councils are economic development directors, county health nurses, chamber of commerce leaders, educators, executives, pastors, EMS, sheriff, business owners, other health care organization leaders, etc. With the ongoing Advisory Councils, we're able to provide quick solutions for each area. We will continue to gather feedback and needs and will work to address each county specifically in our PSA.

5. KEY HEALTH ISSUES

While the area's overall health status is very positive, there continue to be opportunities for improvement. An analysis of the community input received during focus group meetings and advisory councils has helped to identify the key health issues facing Dubois, Martin, Spencer, and Pike Counties. These issues will be analyzed and prioritized.
